The Mayor of Newbury Councillor Adrian Edwards declared the new Huck Net open and gave the following speech:

It gives me great pleasure to be given the opportunity to open this new play equipment here at Blossom's Field.

The Huck Net single structure as it is known is an innovative way of providing children with the opportunity to meet agility, group play, strength, coordination and confidence building needs.

Deborah Wyatt and Beverley Lewis of The Wash Common Jubilee Park project worked hard to raise funds for this equipment. Their aim was to provide more for the 8-14 age range within the Wash Common area. The funds that they raised were added to by Newbury Town Council and through S106 contributions from local developments.

The installation of the Huck Net is the continuation of a longer term project. It is proposed to expand the development of Blossom's Field play area through installing a range of play equipment adjacent to the Huck Net that will further meet the needs of older children.

Attention will be given to making the area more secure and accessible by providing two gated access points with provision for the disabled and improvements to pathways.

We look forward to continuing to provide facilities for the families of the local area.
