# NEWBURY IS BLOOMING LOVELY AGAIN!

The Royal Horticultural Society has awarded Newbury with a Certificate of Recognition for our Britain in Bloom efforts in this difficult year.

Our Newbury in Bloom and Britain in Bloom campaigns were not able to take place this year due to the Coronavirus pandemic. Nonetheless, The RHS has been impressed by our sense of community spirit during this time. The Society recognises that through nature during lockdown, people have valued access to green space and local parks so much more.

The RHS recognises how important the 'In Bloom' campaigns are across the country, including the great efforts that Newbury residents and community groups have made this year.

Newbury Town Council, together with its contractors Continental Landscapes Ltd worked hard to ensure that our parks and open spaces are kept in their best condition throughout 2020 and with beautiful floral displays planted throughout the summer, residents have been able to enjoy Newbury's outdoor spaces for exercise and fresh air throughout.

Newbury Town Council put up over 150 hanging baskets throughout the Town Centre and at Shaw Cemetery and Newtown Road Cemetery in the summer and have planted winter bedding and erected a number of winter hanging baskets.



# CITY RECREATION GROUND GETS A MAKEOVER

Newbury Town Council has carried out extensive improvements at City Recreation Ground over the last few months. With new play equipment, a marked out running loop with gym equipment along the way, a refurbished MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) and even solar lighting, the area has been transformed. The existing worn out pathways were replaced to create the fitness loop using a material made of recycled rubber.

Just before 'lockdown' in March, volunteers helped to plant a beautiful wildflower meadow at City Recreation Ground. In the Spring the flowers started growing and by June they were amass of colour for everyone to enjoy. Together with the Community Orchard, this creates a haven for insects and wildlife in the area. The Town Council's Strategy 2019-2024 is committed to providing outstanding parks, playgrounds and public spaces and this included investing in City Recreation Ground. We are hoping to achieve Green Flag Status for this area, as we have done in Victoria Park for the last two years.
