The Committee heard that an inaugural meeting to establish an Arts Forum was held on 13th November 2018 and very well attended. The matter was being progressed and a further meeting is planned.

37. WORLD WARS WORKING GROUP

The minutes of the World Wars Working Group meeting held on 24 September 2018 were received and noted by the Committee.

Councillor Jo Day gave a verbal report regarding the WW1 Exhibitions & talks, reference was given to the list of events that had been organised over the last 5 years, as at Appendix 1 of these minutes.

Councillor Day formally thanked Phil Woods and Jane Burrell for all their hard work done throughout the whole event, from their research to the manning of the exhibition. Councillor Day went on to thank all those involved.

The Civic Manager, Joyce Lewis reiterated Councillor Jo Day's words of thanks and went on to say that these events would not have happened without the help of all volunteers, Newbury Lions, Newbury Rotary and Councillors

The report regarding the WW1 Battles Over Beacon Event was received and noted by the Committee.

The Chairperson, Councillor Jeanette Clifford thanked Councillor Jo Day and The Civic Manager, Mrs Joyce Lewis and all the volunteers for everything they have done to make these event so successful

48. TOWN HALL OPEN DAY IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE NATIONAL HERITAGE WEEK

Members received a report on the Town Hall Open Day held on Saturday 15 September 2018 in conjunction with the National Heritage Week.

Members agreed to open again next year in conjunction with the National Heritage Open Days and, if the Mayor of the time was agreeable, to consolidate this event with a Mayor's Coffee Morning and to open the same weekend as West Berkshire facilities.

Evaluation Report - World Wars 2018 Exhibition

The official opening of the exhibition took place on Thursday 8 November including a talk by Philip Wood on 'Newbury 1918'. The exhibition was set up that morning and opened on Friday 9th to the public, it then ran to Sunday 18th November 2018 from 10 am to 2 pm during the week and 10 am - 4 pm at weekends. Two school visits of one hour duration each led by ClIrs Jo Day and Margo Payne took place and a visit from a Brownies group took place in the evening. During opening hours, the exhibition was manned by a minimum of 3 stewards to whom I extend sincere thanks for giving so generously of their time.

Three further talks took place enhancing the exhibition experience, all receiving a good size audience.


Overall, the exhibition received 940 visitors, compared to 837 visitors in 2017. Some of the visitors recorded their comments in the visitor's book or on the review sheets.

The Newbury Twin Town Association (NTTA) has enjoyed another busy year of activities in Newbury and visits to our twin towns. Membership is open to all local residents who enjoy taking part in visiting our twin towns or welcoming visitors to Newbury. Activities are publicised in our newsletters, social media and by email communication. Press releases are sent to the Newbury Weekly News for publication.

We had another group of school students visiting from Eeklo in March 2018. This is the 4th year they have come to visit Newbury for the day as part of a week-long school trip, staying at Streatley youth hostel. NTTA members take them for a tour of the town and bring them into the Town Hall to meet the Mayor.

Our members had an opportunity to visit:

- Bagnols, France in May 2018
- Zamosc, Poland in June 2018
- Braunfels, Germany in July 2018
- Feltre, Italy in October 2018

The main focus for the NTTA was the thematic project meeting at Easter 2018 when over 60 visitors from all our twins and associate towns came to Newbury for a 4-day weekend. The theme of the weekend was: Are newcomers European citizens?

Looking ahead to the events taking place in 2019, the association has received invitations to go to

- Carcaixent Spain in March 2019 (the thematic project includes twinning with each other)
- Bagnols France in May 2019
- Braunfels Germany in August 2019
- Kiskunfelegyhaza in September 2019

We are hosting 7 teenagers from Eeklo in March who are spending two weeks in Newbury doing work experience, organised by the Education Business Partnership and funded by Erasmus.

We are hosting an event this year in July, during the carnival weekend when we also celebrate the twinning with Carcaixent. 64 guests have been invited. If you would like to get involved please let me or Gillian Durrant (the membership secretary) know.

Finally, I would like to thank the Town Council for the support given to the Association in 2018 and to the Madam Mayor for the use of the council chamber for our recent AGM and Coffee morning.
