WE NEED YOU! COMMUNITY WILDFLOWER SEEDING AT GREENHAM HOUSE GARDENS

Following other successful community planting and pruning days in the town, Newbury Town Council’s Green Spaces Working Group, in partnership with Newbury in Bloom, are seeking volunteers to help plant a new wildflower meadow at Greenham House Gardens (opposite the ‘Burger King roundabout’) on **Sunday 10 December between 10am and 1pm.**

Cllr Gary Norman, Leader of the Council said, “We have planted very successful wildflower meadows in previous years at Victoria Park, City Recreation Ground and a micro wildflower meadow at Roebutts Close. They look beautiful throughout the summer as well as creating a haven for bees and other insects.



BULB PLANTING IN THE NIGHTINGALES

Volunteers and Councillors came along and braved the weather on Saturday to help plant 3000 spring bulbs at the Nightingales in Newbury. The bulbs were planted on sections of land opposite the Willows School, the bank alongside The Nightingales and an area between Pyle Hill and Austen Gardens.
